

MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm hospitalizations for COVID-19 are nearing peak levels in Montgomery County. The vast majority of new cases and essentially all hospitalizations are in those who are *unvaccinated*.

Of the 174 operational ICU beds in hospitals in Montgomery County, 170 are occupied. This is 37.1% higher than the previous day.



"This graph represents Intensive Care Unit (ICU) Bed Usage. The blue line "ICU Beds in Use" is the reported number of current beds in use daily and is based off of daily ICU bed availability reports. The green line "COVID Patients" indudes suspected and lab confirmed COVID patients admitted to the ICU. The red "ICU Bed Surge" line represents a 20% increase of the orange "Operational ICU Beds" line. This is a federal mandate that facilities must have the capacity to increase their operational beds by 20%. All COVID related questions represent the previous day (midnight to 11590m).

Since our August 6th report, we can confirm an additional death related to COVID-19.

• A woman in her 60s, from Conroe, died in the hospital. She had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19. She was not vaccinated.

We can also confirm:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 822 to 62,543 since Friday's (8/6) report. Of the 822 new cases, 95 are under the age of 12 and not eligible for vaccination.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 642 to 5,480 since Friday's (8/6) report.
- 179 county residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 30,859 people have clinically recovered.

The Testing Positivity Rate for Montgomery County has increased to 21%, up from 19% on Friday.


