This year, our region is planning for a full scale exercise to help estimate the impact of our current emergency plans in response to Anthrax. This will be a multi-day event and we will need volunteer support to help set up two of our POD sites in Montgomery County that will communicate directly with our Emergency Operation Center. If you are interested in participating in this event, there are a couple things you can do to prepare. At the end of summer, we will be hosting another POD training that will provide an in depth review of what a POD site is and the volunteer expectations that we have, we will also be hosting leadership training in September, to encourage more volunteers to take on a leadership role during this exercise.
