MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, is saddened to confirm the county’s 27th death related to COVID-19. A woman in her 60s, from Spring, died while in the hospital. We offer our deepest condolences to her family at this time.

We can also confirm the number of ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 has decreased to 450 today. That number includes 22 hospitalizations. 576 people have fully recovered. The number of total positive cases has increased 20 since yesterday to 1,053. Starting tomorrow, you must make an appointment at this site before obtaining a test. 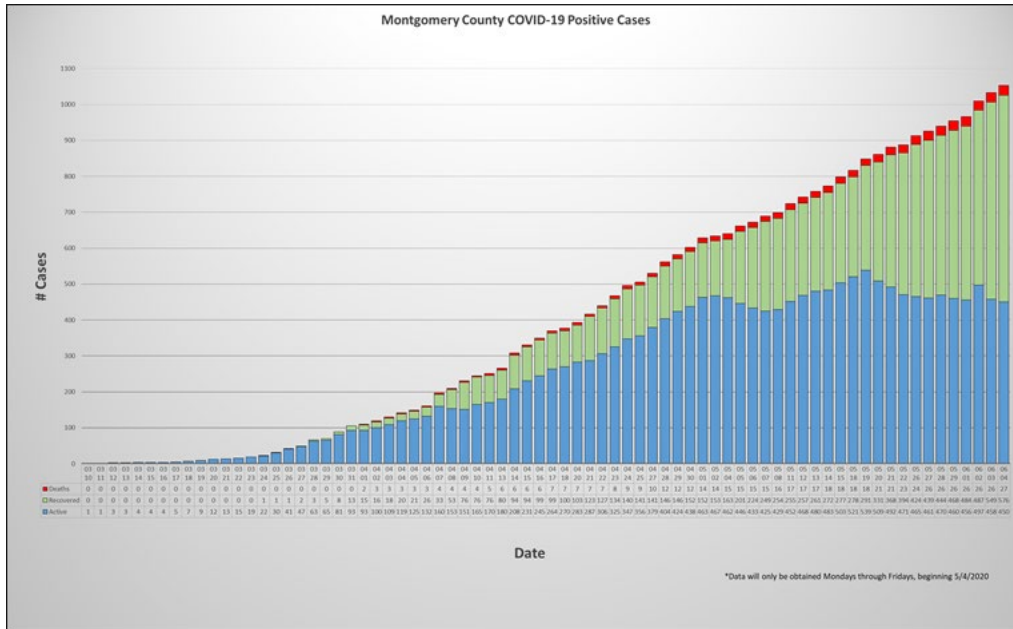
