### **MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE**

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can confirm five additional deaths related to COVID-19. Two hospitalized, a woman in her 60s from Splendora and a man in his 80s from Conroe have died, both had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19. The three out-of-hospital deaths are males, one in his 50s from Porter, one in his 60s and one in his 70s both from New Caney.

We can also confirm the following:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 119 to 6,196 since yesterday's report.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 53 to 2,411 since yesterday's report.
- 66 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 3,613 people have clinically recovered an increase of 167 since yesterday's report.

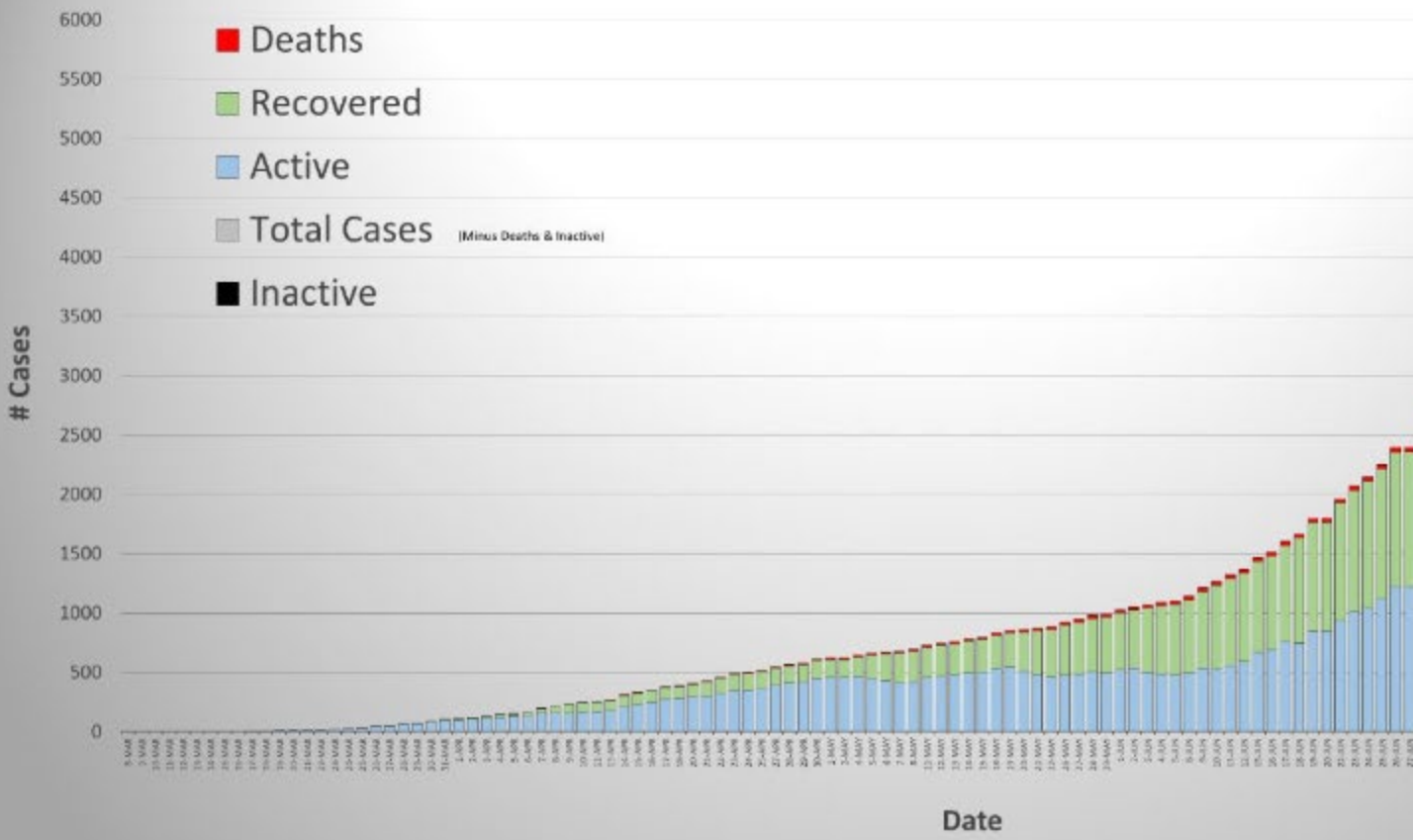
