MONTGOMERY COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, can sadly confirm an additional death related to COVID-19, bringing the total to 77.

A man in his 30s, from Magnolia, died in the hospital. He had co-morbidities in addition to testing positive for COVID-19. We offer our condolences to his family at this difficult time.

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 51 to 6,510 since yesterday's report.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 decreased by 167 to 1,923 since yesterday's report.
- 53 residents are known to be in the hospital, as a result of contact investigations. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 4,338 people have clinically recovered.

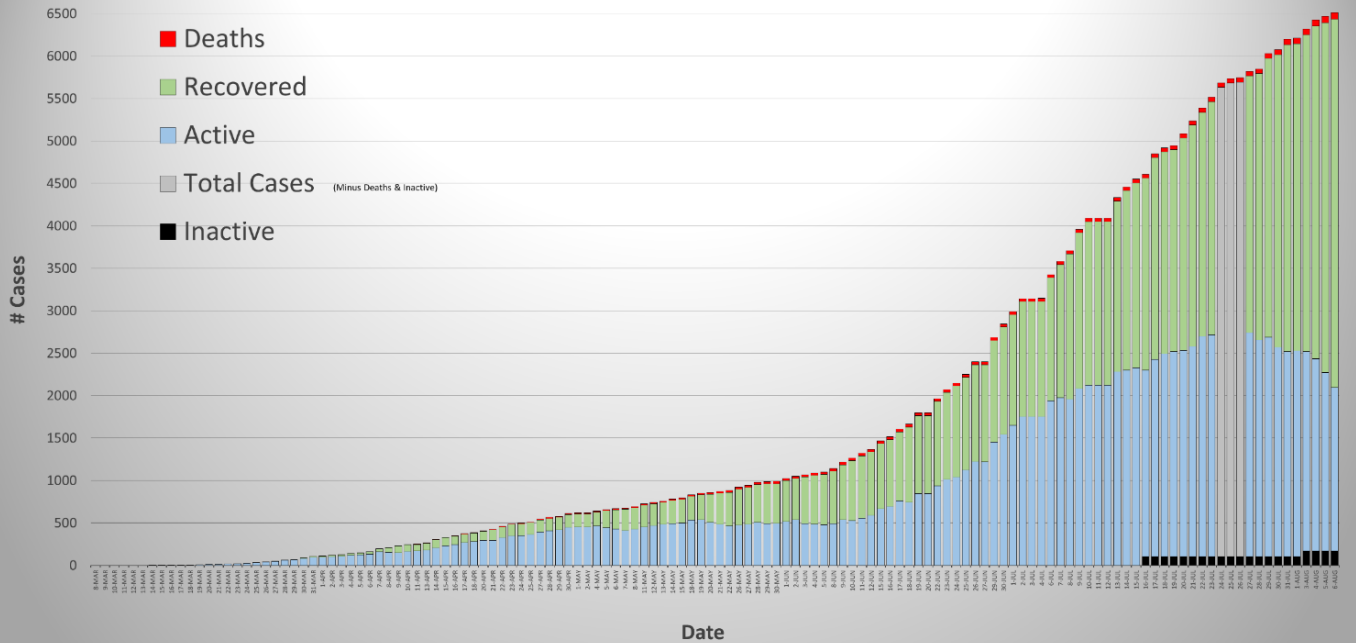
